SECURE THE DOOR FUND

A fund has been established to repay money borrowed from our savings account to provide for a security system throughout the church property. The security system 3 year lease contract of \$7,000.00 will secure 34 doors with an alarm system, door positions switches, motion sensors, door code pads, computer monitor and recorder with motion detection cameras at key doors.

The Business Meeting action of SECURE THE DOOR was established on the basis of \$206.00 per door. If you would like to provide a door, part of a door or doors to SECURE THE DOOR, please use the designated envelopes and mark on your contribution SECURE THE DOOR.

SECURE THE DOOR information is displayed in the foyer outside the Worship Center. Envelopes are also available. Envelopes are available in the Worship Center, the Church office, the Community Life Center and at the SECURE THE DOOR information display.

Can't buy a complete door? Enlist your Sunday school class or some friends to join with you - together, you can buy a door.

Make certain you put your name and the amount of your contribution on the SECURE THE DOOR envelope. Everyone can participate in this project to keep the church property out of the hands of thieves.

WE NEED YOUR HELP

Please telephone the Church office at 655-7451 if:

1. You have a Crestview exterior door key but do not have an authorization code for the alarm system.
2. You have an authorization code but do not have an exterior door key.



FOR YOUR PERSONAL SAFETY SECURITY SYSTEM INSTALLED

The security system is fully operational throughout all of the church buildings.

A key, plus a code authorization, is needed to enter the buildings except during office hours or church function times.

Persons entering are video taped at all times. If you enter the building when the system is armed and you have no authorization code to disarm the system your presence will be detected by a motion detector which creates an alarm at the security service and the police will be notified.

If you need to be in the buildings at some time other than church function times, please clear it with the Church office.



- The exterior doors in every building will remain locked during office hours; however, the system will be unarmed. If you have a key you can enter the buildings without triggering an alarm.
- Certainly, you can always come to the church during office hours when you have need to— simply ring the outside door bell and let us know you are here.
- If you know you are coming to the church phone 655-7451 and let us know. A helpful suggestion would be to phone 655-7451 after you park your car at the church.
- We are all on a learning curve—but it will be a short one. Soon, having a security system at Crestview Baptist Church will be second nature to us all and we can feel assured that the church property is as safe for you as we can make it.
